Five people killed on N4 toll road near Ngodwana

Five people lost their lives this morning on the N4 toll road near Ngodwana. This happened when a VW Polo sedan crashed into the side of an articulated truck and the sedan overturned on the side of the road afterwards killing the five instantly. Thereafter, the Isuzu bakkie also crashed into the truck. The driver was slightly injured. The victims include a child and two women.

It is not yet clear as to what led to the collision, however, the investigation is already underway.

The MEC for Community Safety, Security and Liaison, Vusi Shongwe, is once more calling on motorists to use the road with heightened alertness to avoid death and injury as a result of avoidable crashes.

"We should not be losing lives like this on our roads. Most of these crashes are avoidable and all that motorists need to do is to obey the rules and drive as cautiously as possible," says the MEC.
